Dear Grown-ups,

Your child's report card will be sent to you electronically on March 11th. For some parts of the report card, a 3 is not expected until the end of the school year as developmentally that is when your child is ready to master that skill.

Please review this with your child. When we meet for conferences we will go over additional information and set goals for the next steps of learning.

When you are reviewing the report card, please keep in mind the following:

Grading scale: Characteristics of a learner are graded using a S, I or N meaning satisfactory, improving and needs improvement.

All academic areas are graded using a scale of 1-3, where rubrics below show expectations. Marked with a * are areas new to trimester 2; everything else was also assessed in trimester 1.

Lower case letters: Most children can identify most letters. The q is difficult for quite a few children.

Kid writing: The grading is based on **independent** skills so grading reflects that:

Does your child use punctuation and spacing?

Can your child use word wall/sight words if needed?

Does your child use more than two sounds in words?

Math is reported after each chapter test. If your child did not meet the 3 or the benchmark they are re-taught and then re-assessed once. If they received a 1 or a 2 they are still working on those skills.

Please bring the report card with you to conferences and make note of questions you have.
